#### **Easter Blessings**

As we soon approach Easter, we come again to the most essential Christian festival, a time when we tell the story of Jesus' passion (his journey to the cross, crucifixion and death), and share the good news of Jesus' resurrection.

As we look out into our culture we can see signs of Easter, in hot cross buns and Easter eggs, but we may lament that for many of our society, these items have lost all significance apart from being fun things to consume during Easter.

We have the blessing as Christians to share in the deeper significance of those things that point to the Easter story, the cross being such a powerful symbol of death conquered and sin defeated, the eggs reminding us of the new life that we find in the resurrection. So, while of course we can also have some fun with things like an Easter egg hunt, we do this in the context of the deep and profound meaning of Easter, and the mystery of faith that we are all invited to.

Within this mystery I believe that we have the most powerful and life-changing story to tell, the story of a man born in humble circumstances, who blessed many people, and who lifted up the poor, the oppressed and the forgotten; the story of a man who was wrongly and horribly accused of crimes, when he had committed no crime; the story that seems to end as all our human stories do, in death; the story that through this man, God overcame death and continued the story in a glorious new chapter, inviting all of humanity into that story and the new life we find in Jesus Christ; the story that despite the odds and the humble origins of Jesus and his disciples, spread, survived and has been re-told countless times.

So, as we approach Easter, I invite you to hear this story afresh, through your own devotions and through the services that Lifeworks will hold.

On Maundy Thursday we will have Holy Communion as we think on the Last Supper at our 11am service; at 7pm we will have a 'Tenebrae' service, in near-darkness as we quietly meditate on Jesus' words on the cross. On Good Friday we will have a Stations of the Cross service as we hear the full story of Jesus' passion, with prayer and participation which is relevant to our context as Australians. On Easter Sunday, we will joyfully celebrate the good news of this story, and Jesus' resurrection. While I appreciate that Easter can be a busy time, do you not hear God calling to 'come and see', to be part of the whole story, to journey with Jesus through darkness into glorious night?

Lastly, as we think about our own participation, let us also think about who we can invite to be part of this story. The message of Easter is a profound one, and I have no doubt that many are searching for meaning and depth, and I have no doubt that the Easter story offers that. Who is on our heart and mind, who needs to hear the good news of Jesus? I pray that we will all have the courage to make those invitations that we perhaps haven't made in recent years.

In all these things, I pray that you are blessed, and that you emerge from Easter with deeper faith and love, and deeper knowledge of God's love for you. As we ponder the importance of our Easter story, I leave you with the words of the Apostle Paul from 1st Corinthains 15:3-8

For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to someone untimely born, he appeared also to me.
